



How to get there

- Harwich ferry
- Dover Calais
 - · Ferry or Train
- Portsmouth or Plymouth to Santander or Bilbao

Type of Trip

- Pre-planned Hotels booked, routes in GPS
- Road trip one-night stands
- Destination one or two bases with day trips
- On the fly
 - General area identified, first night and last night hotels booked
 - A new day, a new plan
 - Number of hotel rooms/riders limitation

• Organised commercial trip – eg Magellan, Smith battle sites, BMW, et al

The Legal Bits

- Driving Licence
- - Insurance covers destination countries
 - V5 registration; MoT certificate
 - UK sticker
- Breakdown and recovery covers destination countries
 - Highly Recommended

Paperwork

- You The Usual
 - Money Euros, enough for coffee and a bun every day
 - Credit cards (tell bank counties)
 - Holiday insurance covers destination countries
 - UKGHIC (formerly E1111)
 ICE
- Maps, guide to location, Logis hotels, Sawday's; Chambres d'hôte, etc
- Phrase book / mobile translate app

My Approach to European Touring

The Plan

- Decide on date, duration and destination
 - I would avoid July and August
- Destination will help decide on which crossing you use
- Channel Crossing from Dover, ferry or train
 - 130 miles journey from Ipswich
 - Allow 2.5 hours from Stowmarket to Dover Eastern docks

 - Fill-up before checking-in
 Must arrive in good time to clear French Customs before boarding
 Ferry operators 2 hours.
 Eurotunnel 1 hour

The Plan - Crossing The Channel

- Ferry crossing is my preference
 Relaxed, comfortable, meal, ready for ride on disembarkation
- DFDS my choice is ferry operator
 Crew secure your bike on the car deck
 - Restaurant serving breakfast or lunch
- Crossings
 Dover Calais 1½ hour crossing
 Dover Dunkerque 2 hour crossing
 Newhaven Dieppe
- Brittany Ferries
 Portsmouth Le Harve/Cherbourg, Caen or St Malo



The Plan – Going Further

- Brittany Ferries Portsmouth or Plymouth to Santander or Bilbao
- Scandinavia or north Europe
 - Stena line Harwich to Hook of Holland
- All have the option of a night crossing.
- Cabin cost is additional to the ferry crossing cost
- Remember European time 1 hour ahead of UK

Practicalities for solo rider

- Expanding Tank-bag
 - Passport; autoroute tickets; credit card; wallet
- Decent size top box for *necessary* clothing
- I take as little as possible, often sometimes still too much
- Walker's tee shirts which will wash out and dry overnight
- Old tee shirts and ditch them at the end of the day
- Map even if have GPS
 - North Eastern France will cover the entire route
- Bike Bits
 - Can chain lub; Basic tools; Spare bulbs; Cable ties; Roll strong tape

A Possible Trip for First Timers

- 7 nights in France
- Avallon
 320 miles from Calais; 160 miles SE of Paris
 - Interesting old town with numerous bars and restaurants
 Access to the Morvan National Park; Many places of interest close by
- Either arrive in a day
 - Overnight stay at Dover; Early ferry; Main roads
- Or 2 overnight stops each way 'D' roads; enjoy rural France; see GPX routes later
- And 3 nights in Avallon
- Recommend pre-book all hotels, especially those en route
 Or there's always booking.com





Route to Avallon

- 9 First night, 94 miles
- 17 Second night, 112 miles
- 26 Destination, 128 miles
